Snead State Community College celebrated a new group of Skills for Success CDL graduates who completed hands-on **training in partnership with local employers** — 3C Transportation & Rentals, Just Dump It Dumpster Rentals, and Swords Services.

The CDL lab equipped participants with the **skills and credentials** needed to step into in-demand driving careers. This collaboration highlights how **Alabama businesses and community colleges are working together** to strengthen the workforce.
