- 8,000+ students supported from registration through theory completion and hands-on lab training

- Academy-based training supported across Residential, Facilities, and HEO pathways that led to interviews and employment
- 72% of Skills for Success participants secured quality jobs after course completion; 48% reported increased earnings
- Embedded employer engagement into Skills for Success design to close the gap between certificates and direct job placement
- Collaborated with Career Connect to connect Skills for Success completers with employers and hiring opportunities
- Successfully launched courses in three new industries statewide

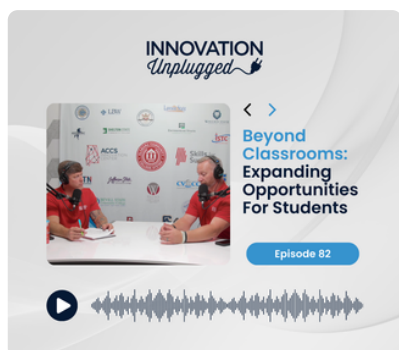
